However, active participation of each student is required during discussions and presentations. The topics and concepts will form the basis for classroom discussions, projects and presentations.

There is a strong continuous assessment dimension to this course. Students are strongly advised to attend all classes and participate effectively in all class activities. 70% attendance is a requirement for a pass grade. (Students with attendance rate of less than 70% will receive an NG grade and will not be allowed to take the final examination).

This is a 2 ECTS course. Students should expect to be studying outside the classroom for an average of 3-4 hours per week.

The medium of teaching and learning is English only.

Textbooks and written assignments should be brought to all classes.
